Emeryville, CA, October 19, 2017 – Next year, Nancy Karp + Dancers will premiere a new dance work, On Beauty, to be created and performed at the David Brower Center, in downtown Berkeley. Inspired by the Brower Center's current exhibition, Douglas R Tompkins: On Beauty, which celebrates the life and work of the late conservationist Doug Tompkins, Karp will make a new site specific performance work for the company.

Rehearsals are open to the public on Monday afternoons at the Brower Center.

Since forming Nancy Karp + Dancers in 1980, Karp has choreographed more than 75 works. over 20 of which are site-specific works. For On Beauty, Karp will create and rehearse the work entirely at the Brower Center, interacting directly with the exhibition and gallery visitors. By seamlessly weaving rehearsal, creative process, and public engagement, On Beauty challenges Karp, the dancers, and gallery visitors to consider the fluidity of boundaries between creating artists and an experiencing public.

The act of seeking beauty, in art and in the natural world, honors ongoing change and diversity. As both a creative process and as a performance. On Beauty explores how beauty is not a fixed ideal but rather an ever-evolving concept. In this way, Karp's devoted pursuit of beauty as a conscious action to combat discord in the world aligns with the mission of the Brower Center: to provide a home for the environmental movement by advocating for the beauty, diversity, and ecological integrity of the Earth. Karp states, "On Beauty will reference imagery from the natural world in the choreography, exploring concepts of stasis and movement, darkness and light, a solid foundation and liquid motion over it, and how the boundaries between these opposites aren't as rigid as they appear."

On Beauty features music by composer Charles Amirkhanian and dancers Sonsherée Giles, Sebastian Grubb, Amy Lewis, Megan Lowe, and Charles Slender-White.

Since forming Nancy Karp + Dancers in 1980, artistic director Nancy Karp has choreographed more than 75 works. She and company members have performed together in many distinguished venues, here and abroad including The Washington Project for the Arts in Washington D.C., The Kitchen in New York, The Walker Art Center in Minneapolis, the Broadway Performance Hall in Seattle, the Für Augen und Ohren and Sprachen der Künste Festivals at the Akademie der Künste in Berlin, Kyoto College of Art in Japan, and the Zagreb Experimental Theater Festival. The company has remained committed to interdisciplinary collaboration, commissioning numerous composers, visual artists and designers in the creation of new dances each season.
